**Liguria** is a coastal strip in North Italy. Long beaches and high, steep cliffs that dive into the sea characterize the beautiful coast of the region. Besides that, Liguria provides the impressing UNESCO World Heritage "Cinque Terre" and the picturesque villages Sestri Levante and Portofino, where the High Society from all over the world gathers. The capital Genoa offers an abundance of artistic and cultural assets.

In the postcard-perfect part Chianti, in between Florence and Siena, the ancient vineyards produce the grapes used for the popular wine. The capital Florence is the birthplace of the Renaissance and full of world-class-art. The "Leaning Tower" of the city of Pisa is known world-wide for its unintended tilt!



**Venetia:** The capital Venice is one of the most alluring cities in the world and unique with its canals and bridges. It is listed as UNESCO World Heritage. Located in the pre-alps, Lake Garda is the largest and most charming lake in Italy! The city of Verona enchants with its Roman amphitheatre. Discover this beautiful region, located between the Alps and the Po River and opening to the Adriatic Sea, what provides its versatile landscape!



The region of **Lazio** offers everything from sea and nature to famous UNESCO World Heritage Sites and lovely villages rich in history and art. Discovering Lazio is like leafing through a history book! The capital Rome is the cradle of civilization and impresses with masterpieces from the antique, renaissance and baroque. And around Rome, the hills, lakes, rivers and vineyards offer diversity and attractions for nature lovers.



The **Amalfi Coast** is an enchanting stretch of coastline along the Gulf of Salerno and dazzles with its mysterious grottos, craggy cliffs and shimmering bays. It is listed as UNESCO World Heritage and offers impressing cities like Pompeji, Naples, Ravello and artsy Positano. 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**Lombardy** is located in the north of Italy, sharing a border with Switzerland. Beautiful lakes in the pre-alps, such as Lake Como, Lake Garda and Lago Maggiore promise a holiday full of relaxation, pleasure and culture! The capital of the region is Milano, which offers an abundance of history and arts, like the famous Leonardo's Last Supper. The UNESCO World Heritage Sites of Mantua and Sacri Monti are worth a visit as well!



**Piedmont**, located at the foot of the towering Alps is a must for any wine lover. Speckled with vineyards it is home to some of the best wines in Italy. The Barolo is grown in the hilly areas of Langhe and Alba while not too far away in Asti, the delicious Asti Spumante is produced. The region is rich with old villages and castles. Town of Turin, home to the Dukes of Savoy, enchants with its baroque architecture.



Beautiful **Sicily** is the largest of the Italian islands and full of evidence of its 3000 year old history. Discover famous UNESCO World Heritage Sites and the gigantic Vulcano Etna, which is Europe's tallest active volcano! Nature seems to have endowed all its wonders to this island: mountains, hills and above all the sea with its incredible colors, its crystal-clear water and beautiful islands like the Isole Eolie.



**Emilia-Romagna** is also known as „Terra di Motori“ – it is the home of famous sports cars such as Ferrari and Maserati. The cuisine offers a wide range of delicious products - parma ham, „Parmigiano Reggiano“ cheese and the well-known balsamic vinegar. Charming coastal towns such as Rimini, Riccione and Cattolica ensure relaxation and fun and the Po-Delta offers prominent UNESCO World Heritage Sites in Ravenna, Ferrara and Modena.



**Puglia** is located at the southeast of Italy. The region has an 800km long coast. Flat plains alternate with sharp cliffs of the Gargano promontory and striking canyons of the Alta Murgia National Park. Characteristic for Puglia are the "Trulli" houses with their "pointed-cap" roofs and the "Masserie" - former, mostly castle-like estates, which today are used as hotels, apartments or restaurants.



**Marche** has been home to many writers in the past. The region connects the mountains with the sea. Here you can find endless beaches as well as alpine landscapes, such as the national park of the Monti Sibillini and Monte Conero. Without masses of tourists you can stroll in contemplative villages along Romanesque churches and family led trattorias. Indulge in an "aperitivo" at the Piazza del Popolo in Ascoli Piceno or visit Palazzo Ducale in Urbino.



**Umbria** is known locally as the "green heart of Italy" and is home to the truffle. In the west there are flat hills. In the east more than 2.000m high Apennine mountains separate Umbria from the Marche. The Lake Trasimeno is one of the cleanest seas in Italy. In medieval villages such as Assisi, Orvieto, Deruta, Bettona or Montefalco you can relax in a nice café, have a drink and watch the people passing by.
